

Mathematical and Computational Modelling of Covid-19 Transmission

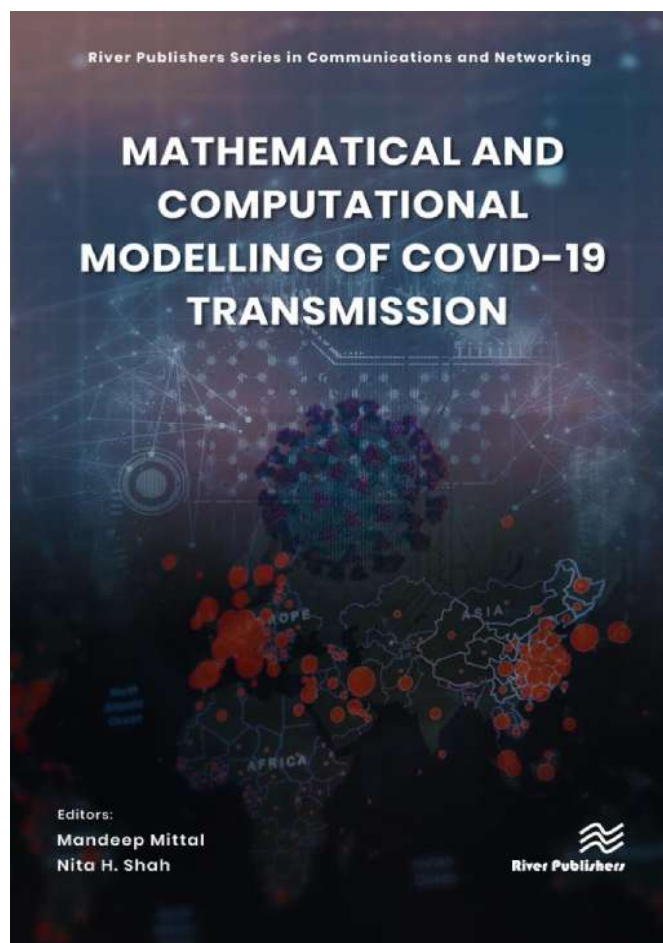
